CONSERVING THE ENVIRONMENT

I've led and participated in several activities related to forestry conservation, environment preservation, and public awareness of the environment. Through this work, I've nurtured a passion for conservation, and I intend to further develop my understanding and knowledge of the environment at the university level. Most of my work so far has centered on involvement with my family's tree farm, which is certified by the American Tree Farm System and was distinguished as Ohio's "Tree Farm of the Year" in 2004 against a field of over 1800 eligible candidates (see burntridgetreefarm.com for more information). Below is a summary of my work related to conserving the environment:

- *Copley High School Environmental Club* (2008-present)
 - 2009 president
 - Participate in a recycling program, collecting recyclables from classrooms and separating them into special units for collection by the Township.
 - Raise funds for Sea Turtles via The Nature Conservancy through school bake sales.
- *Ginseng plantation.* (2006)
 - Helped prepare planting beds for approximately 6,400 (1 pound) stratified ginseng seeds.
 - Plan to install protective measures against white tail deer browsing.
- *Birds & Bugs & Board Feet education field day.* (2004)
 - Helped coordinate visit for 40+ attendees from the state and local chapters of the Audubon Society and various woodland owner groups in Ohio.
 - Assisted Dr. David Horn of The Ohio State University Department of Entomology, past president of the Columbus Ohio chapter of the Audubon Society, with creating insect and bird displays, and conducting walking tours.
- *Ornithology study.* (2004)
 - Helped conduct an audible response survey of Cerulean Warblers at 3 locations in 1/2 mile distance increments, including estimates of forest basal area, canopy height and density.
 - Recorded two audible responses in the survey.
 - Contributed to the first coordinated, region-wide count of Cerulean Warblers in the Central Hardwoods, preliminary results of which suggested more birds are breeding in the region than previously assumed.
- *2004 Ohio "Tree Farm of the Year" Tour.* (2004)
 - Assisted in preparation of family tree farm by marking walking trails with ribbon and setting up tent areas.
 - Welcomed and assisted guests and directed them to the various stations/speakers, helped with children's activities at the Project Learning Tree education station, and helped with serving lunch to well over 300 people in attendance.
- *Re-forestation project.* (2002)
 - Collected, float-tested for viability, and counted 5,000 red oak acorns.
 - Participated in planting the 5,000 red oak acorns on a 15-acre forest unit.

- *Led various groups in all 4 key components of Tree Farm: wood, water, wildlife and recreation. (2000-present)*
 - Led friends and Cub Scouts on hikes and day trips to discover and view wildlife.
 - Assisted in identification and collection of plaster castings of wildlife foot prints.
 - Organized pond fishing adventures and related aquatics study with emphasis on water quality.
 - Promoted sustainable forestry education and awareness by sharing and demonstrating various tools and techniques used in prescribed Timber Stand Improvement (TSI) applications.
 - Helped locate and identify specific biodiversity and wildlife habitat areas created by active forest management and TSI.

OTHER EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- German Club founding member (2008-present). Established this club to advance students' proficient speaking, reading and writing of the German language beyond the limits of the classroom.
 - Organized trips to the Kris Kindle Mart (outdoor food and German festival in Akron, Ohio) and to the Akron Art Museum display of German World War II cartoons and political drawings.
 - Arranged club viewings of several German language films.
- Key Club International member (2008-present). Key Club International is the high school club system under Kiwanis International, a non-profit organization dedicated to developing young leaders through community improvement activities.
